It is not an act of the will to be kind, patient etc. No. It has to be the Spirit of Christ

working in and through us if we are to demonstrate true Christ-likeness. In essence, we must surrender – give in – to our own will and allow Christ to do His work in our lives. Much like the guy who floats seamlessly in a pool by surrendering his body to the water, we too are to surrender to Christ. The key ingredient, of course, is faith – trust that God will do what He says He'll do. Faith

in Romans 8:28; faith that He who is in us is greater than the one who is in the world (1 John 4:4) and a keen understanding that "without faith, it is impossible to please God" (Hebrews 11:6). No wonder Paul concluded that, "For me to live is Christ..." (Philippians 1:21). He recognized that he was totally dependent on Christ and that only through the Holy Spirit, can Christ provide us everything we need to experience the abundant life He promised.

"I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me." (Galatians 2:20)

How dependent are we (truly) on Jesus Christ? Do we still mix legalism with grace? Are

we guilty of trying to perform or achieve to be in right standing with God? If so, take a deep breath and hand it over to the Lord. Let's start to live by faith and adopt an attitude of total dependency on Christ to live His life through us (and often, in spite of us!)
