man? But I am stubborn!" Perhaps a better word than "stubborn" would be humble. Guardiola was humble enough to recognize his need for help. Humble enough to spend time — lots of time — learning a foreign language. So, if Pastor Rick and Coach Guardiola believe in the need to keep learning, what's our excuse? Could it be (dare I say it)...Pride?! If so, it's time to let go of this distasteful attitude, and instead "Clothe ourselves with humility" (1 Peter 5:5),



staying open to new information and to the ideas of others. May we never be afraid of making mistakes (or too prideful to admit them)!
